

PART – A

Plan of action chalked out by IQAC for 2008-2009.

- 1) Free Medical Check-up Camps were organised for the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college.
- 2) A feather in the cap for Patkar-Varde College was the launching of another platform for the Girls' students to channelise their energy in the form of NCC unit, Army wing under the 8, Maharashtra Girls Battalion, Mumbai – A group. 52 seats have been sanctioned to our unit. However, only 25 girls enrolled since the unit started in December 2008. 11 cadets will be appearing for the 'B' Certificate examination. 3 girl cadets completed the Civil Defence Course with flying colours.
- 3) One Day Workshop was arranged on "Communication Skills and Etiquette" for the non-teaching staff of the college.
- 4) As a part of continuous technology upgradation process, the college has purchased 2 DLP projectors, a licensed software eight port switch and UTP cable, external DVD writer, 6 new computers and MTNL router.
- 5) State level "SET Workshop" in Life Sciences was organised by the institution on 17th & 18th November 2007. 20 participants who enrolled for the workshop were guided by a distinguished faculty from Pune University.
- 6) Chemistry Department organised a one-day workshop on revised syllabus of Practicals for First Year B.Sc. on 29th August 2008. 30 teachers from 10 colleges participated and benefited from the workshop.
- 7) College was planning to conduct an International Conference this year but due to RAR preparation for NAAC visit, the programme has been postponed.

1. **Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.**

In addition to subject-wise associations, college has several committees like Women Development Cell, Students' Grievance Cell, Placement Cell, Student Council, Career Guidance Cell, Library Advisory Committee, Nature Club, Hiking Association, Alumni Association, Cultural Association which also play an important role in organizing various activities and shaping the personality of the students for a brighter future.

Our students have participated in around 60 Intercollegiate events and have bagged several prizes.

College also organizes such events like "Raves" and "Fiesta-e-Josh" which are Intercollegiate sports and cultural events. 36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling Unit:

The Counselling Cell of the College organized a 'Career Guidance' talk for the students of SYBA/SYBCom. as their classroom activity. The students were made aware of various career options and their doubts were cleared. They were also guided as to how to go about selecting their careers.

Individually a number of students approached the counselor for problems related to their family relationships, rejection and studies.

Some students required a number of sessions, at the end of which they reported relief from anxiety and stress.

37. Placement services provided to students.

Department of Information Technology

Campus Interviews were organized by the following IT Companies

Department of B.Com. (Banking & Insurance)

(Banking & Insurance) were selected as apprentices. The Company would be providing on-the-job training and would also pay stipend to the selected students. Small Oral Interviews were conducted to test the students knowledge and on that basis overall judgement was made and further the selection procedure was done. The seminar-cum-workshop of Bharati Axa Life Insurance Company Ltd. was held on two days, one for T.Y.B.Com. and another for S.Y.B.Com.

38. Development programmes for Non-Teaching Staff:

- a) A talk on “Brahmavidya” will be arranged shortly for overall development and wellbeing of the Non-Teaching Staff.
- b) A basic training programme in computers will be organized for the benefit of Non-Teaching Staff in near future.

39. Healthy practices of the institution:

- 1) Educating students against using unfair means during the examination.
- 2) Students’ feedback reports are obtained for teachers, non-teaching staff, library, canteen, gymkhana, campus, cleanliness etc.
- 3) Modern teaching aids are used by the teachers of Aided and Unaided Sections.
- 4) There is a separate girls reading room in the library.
- 5) A separate low lying table and a chair has been arranged for the differently abled students in the library.
- 6) Blind students : Special care is taken of the blind students. Braille material in the form of 13 books and 3 journals have been purchased by the college library.
- 7) Canteen – A proper Canteen Committee has been constituted which occasionally pays surprise visits to check the quality of food and general hygiene.
- 8) Principal & Vice-Principals frequently check the Identity Cards of the students in the college campus, canteen, corridors, ground etc. Defaulters are made to pay fine in the college office.
- 9) Strict instructions have been issued to students and teachers to refrain from using mobiles in the lecture rooms, library and laboratories.
- 10) Vice-Principals take regular rounds during the lectures to check whether all lectures are being taken according to time-table. Defaulting teachers are instructed to be punctual and regular.
- 11) Xerox copy of Master Time-Tables are kept in the Staff Common Room for the benefit of all. To maintain transparency, individual time-tables of all the teachers are also kept for reference.
- 12) Teachers using the vehicles were told to submit Registration Number of their vehicles which have been given to security personnel posted at the main gate for security reasons.

A) Academic -

1) University Rankholders :

Continuing the tradition of the college, two of our students have secured ranks in the University Examinations. Mr. Riyaz Khan of B.Sc. IT topped the University of Mumbai and Ms. Sayyed Azra of B.Sc. (Zoology) secured the second rank in the University Exam.

2) Science Association : Science Association worked for all the students and teachers making them aware about science and its development. Every year, Science Association organizes different kinds of activities for students, teachers and the society such as, this year (2008-09) Science Association displayed laminated posters on “Nobel Laureates” on 17/09/2008, particularly those who have been awarded a Nobel prize for physiology and medicine. Association also displayed a poster of Indian Nobel Laureates. 183 posters were displayed (from 1901 to 2007). The exhibition was open to all. Many staff and students of our college benefited from this exhibition.

Science Association also organised a quiz contest and displayed posters on “Exploring the Nature” on 30th November 2008. The association gave appreciation prizes to the winners.

3) Chemspark : Chemspark, Association of the Department of Chemistry, conducts various activities to improve knowledge and skills of students and teachers in the subject of Chemistry.

University of Mumbai implemented revised syllabus in the subject of Chemistry for F.Y.B.Sc. w.e.f. academic year 2008-09. Hence, Chemspark Association held a one day workshop on “F.Y.B.Sc Practicals in Inorganic Chemistry” on 29th August 2008. Dr. R. G. Deshmukh (syllabus committee member University of Mumbai, Principal Konkan Gyaan Peeth, College of Arts and Commerce and Science, Karjat) conducted the workshop.

To obtain a first hand knowledge of industry, its functioning and Research and Development, department organised an industrial visit on 8th, 9th and 10th of January 2009 for students of T.Y.B.Sc. (Chemistry) and M.Sc. – I & II (Chemistry) was organised at Gharda Chemicals, Nerolac and Excel Industries at MIDC Chiplun, Maharashtra.

B) Extension Activities -

1) N.C.C. –

8th Maharashtra Girls Battalion :- A feather in the cap of Patkar-Varde College was the launching of another platform for the girls' students to channelise their energy in the form of NCC unit, Army wing under the 8th Maharashtra Girls Battalion, Mumbai 'A' group.

25 girls cadets were enrolled during 2008-2009. 11 students out of these will be appearing for the 'B' Certificate Examination.

3 girl cadets completed the civil defence course and passed the examination with flying colours, under the able guidance of NCC officer Lt. Nilima Prabhu.

3rd Maharashtra Battalion :-

56 students were enrolled for NCC boys during the year 2008-2009. In addition to the regular activities like Independence Day and Republic Day Functions, the NCC cadets participated and secured recognitions in various activities which are as follows -

- Two of our Cadets Cdt. Javed M. Sayyed and Cdt. Rohan V. Jagtap attended the RDC (Republic Day Camp) and reached upto Pre RDC Camp, Pune headquarters.
- One of our Cdt. Sachin B. Khade attended the Thal Sainik Camp Course and reached up to T S C – II Camp, at Amravati.
- Our two NCC Cadet CSM-Vijay Akhade, Cdt.-Suresh Polekar, won 3rd prize in Disaster Management State Level Camp held at Nagpur.
- Various competitions were held among three coy's to develop the inherent qualities.
- Our NCC cadets played the role in Hindi film "Heroes", They performed "Shoksalami" under the guidance of our ANO. His name was highlighted in that movie.
- Cdt. Shivaji Mahagaonkar has been selected for Fire Brigade Course.
- Our Ex Cdt. JUO Rajesh Vaddi of the batch 2005-06 is commissioned as Lt. Rajesh Vaddi in IMA.
- Our ten cadets were selected for section battle drill on NCC Day Camp held at Colaba Mumbai.
- Anam Prem is one of the pravah institute in which our cadet gave shoksalami to those who were Shahids in war.
- Our unit participated in an anti-terrorism rally at Bhavan's College.
- 25 Cadets attended Ganpati Visarjan Bandobastha held at Girgaon Chowpatti and Dadar Chowpatti.
- Our Cdt. SUO Shailesh S. Surve passed CDSE Exam and appearing in SSB interview, got 'A' grade in NCC 'B' Certificate and passed in SYBSc with First Class.
- Our Cdt. CSM Vijay P. Akhade got 'A' grade in NCC 'B' Certificate, attended Army Attachment Camp and got Best Squad Senior in All Over Maharashtra in Nagpur Camp at State Level.
- 22 cadets of NCC have completed Civil Defence Course control by Government of Maharashtra from 11 January 2009 to 24th January 2009 which was held at Patkar College, Goregaon (W), Mumbai.
- 2 Cdt. of our unit selected for Police Service and one of the cadets selected for army service.
- Cdt. Akshay Joshi joined as Technical Soldier in Army Services, Orissa.

2) N.S.S. –

The overall aim of National Service Scheme is to give a dimension to the higher education system and to orient the student youth to community service while they are studying in educational institution.

A total of 85 volunteers were registered for the year 2008-2009 of which 32 were girls and 53 boys.

Following activities were carried out during the year.

- a) Short films based on social issues were shown to NSS volunteers.
- b) Participation in Hiroshima Day Peace Rally on 06/08/2008 to spread awareness about the harmful devastating effects of nuclear weapons.
- c) Raakhee sale was organised on 16/08/2008 to help the mentally challenged students of Punarwas. Punarwas is a special and vocational Training Centre for mentally challenged children and adults. NSS Volunteers personally visited Punarwas and saw how mentally challenged students were making Rakhis. More than 150 rakhis were sold by NSS volunteers of Patkar College. The money earned was directly handed over to Punarwas. NSS unit acknowledges all those students and staff members who purchased Rakhis and extended a helping hand in this noble act.
- d) National Flag Sale – One of the important motives of each NSS volunteer of Patkar College is to help the underprivileged. That is why they came forward to help “Hightech Foundation” by selling flags made by mentally challenged people. NSS volunteers sold five hundred National flags to their friends and teachers on ‘No-Profit’ basis. The money acquired by this college level activity was submitted to the foundation.
- e) Cheering of Common Wealth Baton run on 06/09/2008
- f) Ganesh Visarjan is a University Level Activity in which every year NSS volunteers of Patkar-Varde College participate in large numbers.
- g) A Blood Donation Camp and Thalassaemia Minor Screening Camp was organised by NSS in collaboration with Prabodhan and Siddhartha Municipal Hospital, Goregaon on 18/09/2008. 107 students donated blood and 158 students got themselves checked up for Thalassemia minor and anaemia. In all four cases of Thalassaemia minor and forty seven cases of iron deficiency anaemia were detected, who have been advised to go for counseling sessions.
- h) As a part of NSS day celebration, the NSS volunteers participated in a poster making competition on the following topics.
 - i) AIDS
 - ii) Nature Conservation.More than 40 posters were subsequently displayed on the common notice-board to spread awareness among the college students about AIDS and nature conservation.
- i) NSS volunteers distributed more than 350 free passes, arranged by MDAC, for a musical concert by well known singer Shaan, held on 1st December 2008, the World AIDS Day. Function was organised to educate the students towards HIV/AIDS patients and to make each student realize her/his role in preventing AIDS.
- j) In the forthcoming Lok Sabha Elections to be held in April-May 2009, a large number of students will be voting for the first time. Realizing the need to spread awareness among students towards their voting right, NSS in association with Jaago India.com organised a seminar on ‘exercise of Voting Rights’. The seminar organised on December 2, 2008 was attended by more than 300 students. Facilities for on-line registration in voters list were made

available to the students where they could fill up the forms and get themselves registered in the voters list.

- k) NSS Camp : was organised at Manor village of Thane district from 21/12/2008 to 27/12/2008. During their stay, the NSS volunteers undertook activities like tree plantation, cleanliness drive of the local market area, temple, Ali Alan School, Municipal Hospital and Counselling of the local school students regarding career guidance.

C) Extra-curricular Activities -

1. a) Students Council paid homage to brave soldiers who sacrificed their lives during the Mumbai terror attacks, on 6th December 2008.
b) Students Council organised Annual Day Celebration on 5th January 2009. Teachers and students who brought laurels to the college were also felicitated on this occasion.
- 2) School-College Complex Activity –
Every year, the school – college complex organizes practical training sessions for students of VI and IX classes appearing for the Homi Bhabha Scholarship Examination. This year, nearly 100 students from 15 nearby schools of English and Marathi medium alongwith their teachers were benefited from the activity.
- 3) RAVES : Like all these years, RAVES an Intercollegiate Cultural Event, was organised on 18th and 19th December 2008. This year's theme was "Junkyard". Of the 25 colleges which participated this year, some were from Pune as well. Event was graced by MLA Shri. Subhash Desai, Shri. Dilip Salaskar – brother of Martyr Shri. Vijay Salaskar, Shri. Dilip Shinde. Some of the competitions were Rangoli, Best from waste, photography, ad-making, tattoo making, debate, just a minute elocution, quiz, RJ hunt, solo dance, skit, solo singing, monoacting, EA FIFA, Counter strike, EA cricket, pickle ball, football, chess, archery, fashion show, fusion dance, personality contest, band event and informals.
Fiesta-e-Josh : NAC department of the college organised Inter Collegiate Festival "Fiesta-e-Josh" on 10th & 11th January 2009. Theme of the Festival was Indian defence and the festival was dedicated to the people who sacrificed their lives in 26/11 terror attacks.
There were 34 events classified under Management, Fine Arts, Sports and LAN games. The mega events were treasure hunt, rescue mission and live counter strike. Nearly 41 colleges with different streams participated in the festival.
