Students have been approaching her for problems related to career by and large. Career guidance and vocational planning lectures were conducted for S.Y.B.A. and S.Y.B.Com. students.

Many students also approached to discuss behavioral problems and difficulties related to relationship maladjustment.

One student from S.Y.B.Com. had to undergo psychotherapy with various follow-up sessions to deal with deep-seated childhood fears and severe mal functioning of relationships within family.

The student responded very well to the therapy and by the end of the academic year the sessions were terminated. The student is now in T.Y.B.Com. and is also pursuing C.A. The relationships within the family have improved tremendously.
