RESEARCH ON CHILDREN AND ADVERTISING THEN AND NOW: CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUTURE RESEARCH

New forms of advertising to children (such as "unboxing videos" and "vlogs") necessitate new studies and examinations of ethics, advertising literacy, and regulations. At the same time, it is useful to re-examine and question assumptions about traditional media and persuasion tactics. This special issue on children and advertising offers seven articles that question the status quo or present findings on new tactics and new interventions. 

NEW GAIA DATA PAINT THE MOST DETAILED PICTURE YET OF THE MILKY WAY

The catalog includes asteroids, galaxies and the stuff between stars for the first time.



New data from the Gaia spacecraft were used to make this map of interstellar dust in the Milky Way, with high concentrations (black) diminishing (from yellow to blue) farther away from the galactic plane. The patterns here carry traces of billions of years of galaxy mergers, supernovas and new-born stars.

The European Space Agency's Gaia space observatory, which launched in 2013, has long surpassed its goal of charting more than a billion stars in the Milky Way (*SN: 10/15/16*). On June 13, the mission extended that map into new dimensions, releasing more detailed measurements of hundreds of millions of stars, plus — for the first time — asteroids, galaxies and the dusty medium between stars.

SAMPLES OF THE ASTEROID RYUGU ARE SCIENTISTS' PUREST PIECES OF THE SOLAR SYSTEM

Analysis reveals the asteroid was evolving about 5 million years after the solar system's start



The 31 milligrams of dust and debris from asteroid Ryugu seen in this photo, along with several other samples, are the most pristine pieces of the solar system scientists have ever studied. Samples of the asteroid Ryugu are the most pristine pieces of the solar system that scientists have in their possession. A new analysis of Ryugu material confirms the porous rubble-pile asteroid is rich in carbon and finds it is extraordinarily primitive (SN: 3/16/20). It is also a member of a rare class of space rocks known as CI-type, researchers report online June 9 in Science. Their analysis looked at material from the Japanese mission Hayabusa2, which collected 5.4 grams of dust and small rocks from multiple locations on the surface of Ryugu and brought that material to Earth in December 2020 (SN: 7/11/19; SN: 12/7/20).

TRANSITION TO RENEWABLE ENERGY AT 'STANDSTILL'

Fossil fuels are still dominating the energy market according to a report which said the world missed a prime opportunity for a green recovery following COVID-19 lockdowns.

The Renewables 2022 Global Status Report released by global renewable energy network, REN21, showed that while global energy consumption has risen by 4% in 2021, use of renewable energy has only grown minimally.

Continued reliance on fossil fuels has led to a 6% rise in carbon dioxide emissions, the equivalent of two billion tonnes, while renewables accounting for just 12.6% of total final energy consumption in 2020.

Despite 135 countries having net zero targets, it was discovered major investment still goes towards fossil fuels. Subsidies worth \$5.9tn were invested in the industry in 2020, while just \$366bn was invested in renewables the following year.

SOIL HEALTH IS AT RISK FROM GLOBAL WARMING

A new study has highlighted that rising temperatures are reducing microbial diversity, with devastating consequences for ecosystems and food security.

Research conducted by a team at the University of Oklahoma has identified a worrying link between soil health and global warming, with serious implications for plants, animals and people.

The results of an eight-year experiment have shown that as the planet becomes hotter, the diversity of microbial life is reducing. This is concerning given such organisms are essential for soil health, and losing them in turn places entire ecosystems at risk, potentially impacting food chains and security.

'Climate change is a major driver of biodiversity loss from local to global scales, which could further alter ecosystem functioning and services,' said Jizhong Zhou, P.hD., director of the Institute for Environmental Genomics at the University of Oklahoma, and lead author of the study. 'Despite the critical importance of belowground soil biodiversity in maintaining ecosystem functions, how climate change might affect the richness and abundant distribution of soil microbial communities (bacteria, fungi, protists) was unresolved.

AS EDTECH FIRMS VENTURE INTO OFFLINE CLASSES, HIRING WAR FOR STAR TEACHERS IS INTENSIFYING

Rs 10 crore per annum: it's the one figure that people can't stop talking about in the test-prep circles. This is the compensation package that edtech unicorn Unacademy allegedly offered star physics teacher Ashish Arora to come on board, as senior vice-president and national head-academics, from Allen Career Institute in Jaipur where he had spent close to a decade building the branch, according to multiple industry sources.

(Unacademy did not respond to ET's emailed queries on compensation.) It's a figure that is emblematic of the peak the scramble for "star teachers" has reached. This is driven by venture capital-funded edtech unicorns expanding into the lucrative, offline competitive exam or test-prep market as, post-pandemic, students return to physical classrooms and coaching hubs like Kota.

IPL MEDIA RIGHTS: MUKESH AMBANI OPTED OUT OF TV RIGHTS CHASE IN BATTLE FOR CRICKET DEAL

Mukesh Ambani's group ultimately dropped the pursuit of television broadcast rights to India's top cricket league that Walt Disney Co. secured for \$3 billion as the Indian conglomerate saw limited opportunity for long-term profit from the legacy platform. The joint venture between Ambani's

Reliance Industries Ltd

NSE -2.19 %. And US media giant Paramount Global instead focused on winning the rights to digitally stream the lucrative Indian Premier League, betting its advertising revenue will be fourfold bigger than that for TV in five years, a person familiar with the group's strategy said. The view was that television would struggle to deliver double digit growth, according to the person, While Viacom18 Media Pvt., the Ambani-Paramount JV, bid for TV rights in the initial rounds of the auction, this person said the focus was always on ensuring it secured digital rights. A representative for Reliance Industries

Viacom18 paid 238 billion rupees (\$3.1 billion) for the rights to stream the IPL tournament, one of the world's most-watched sporting events, almost on par with what Disney shelled out. The decision gels with Ambani's ambitions for his digital unit

BOMBAY HIGH COURT REJECTS DISH TV PROMOTERS' PLEA AGAINST YES BANK

The Bombay High Court on Friday rejected Dish TV India

NSE -8.81 % promoter World Crest Advisors' plea to restrain YES Bank from voting at the company's extraordinary general meeting on June 24.

The development is the latest in the dispute between Dish TV chairman and managing director Jawahar Goel and YES Bank, a lender to the direct-to-home broadcaster, over corporate governance and fundraising plans.

Justice AK Menon rejected the petition as ad-interim relief seeking to restrain Catalyst Trusteeship and Yes Bank from participating in and/or exercising any right, including voting rights, at the EGM. Catalyst Trusteeship is the security trustee for the shares that were pledged to Yes Bank.

MISSING MASTERPIECE WORTH RS 2.5 CRORE FOUND HANGING ON EMPTY BUNGALOW WALL IN LONDON



After being lost for decades, a masterpiece oil painting was found hanging in an unoccupied bungalow of a 90-year-old woman in London. While the woman was oblivious of its value, the painting fetched nearly Rs 2.5 crore when it went under the hammer, reported The Independent. The valuable painting is the depiction of the Madonna and Child, painted by Italian painter Filippo Lippi in the 15th century. The oil painting remained missing for years before being accidentally found hanging on the wall of a bungalow in Enfield town. It turned out that the owner of the house, a woman in her 90s, was given the painting by her father more than 30 years ago.

YARD SALE DRAWING BOUGHT FOR RS 2,000 TURNS OUT TO BE GERMAN ART WORTH RS 74 CRORE



A drawing bought for \$30 (Rs 2000) from a Yard sale in 2017 was later discovered to be a German Renaissance art valued at more than \$10 million (Rs 74 crore). As per Agnes Gallery, the London art gallery currently in possession of this artwork, the drawing titled 'The Virgin and Child' was created by Albrecht Dürer who is regarded as the greatest German artist in history. But Durer's works were not just limited to such artworks and he also counted among the most significant and intellectual figures of the European Renaissance, reported CNN. This particular painting was discovered in 2019 by a Boston-based art collector and consultant for the gallery, Clifford Schorer who stumbled upon this piece during a bookstore visit in Massachusetts. The bookstore owner told Schorer that his friend had a 14th century Durer drawing and asked if he would like to see it. "caliber" by the artist was discovered was more than 100 years ago.

WHY INDIAN HISTORY MUST BE WRITTEN AS PER HISTORICAL EVIDENCE AND NORMS, AND NOT IDEOLOGICAL AGENDAS


Our 'eminent' historians and social scientists argue that the nature of history is static and there is not enough new evidence that could warrant the rewriting or revision of history and history textbooks. There is a lot of noise being made on the new education policy and rewriting of history and social sciences textbooks. Demands for rewriting history and removing distortions are becoming stronger, and voices turning shriller and shriller. In order to understand this, let us revisit the history of this issue itself. In the Indian context, history textbooks and history writings first became a matter of media attention when during the Vajpayee government, NCERT took up the revision of the National Curriculum Framework and the textbooks of all subjects prepared almost four decades ago. While there was no problem with the revision of textbooks in any other subject, all hell broke loose when it came to history and social sciences textbooks. The 'eminent' historians/social scientists who were involved in writing history/social sciences textbooks and their students and supporters began a campaign that history/social sciences books cannot be rewritten or revised. They argued that the nature of history was static and there was not enough new evidence that could warrant the rewriting or revision of history and history textbooks.

DECODING THE GREAT HISTORICAL CONSPIRACY TO TURN SARASWATI INTO A MYTHICAL RIVER



Recent scientific research, British era documentations by geologists and other experts, and our ancient texts speak of a mighty river that originated in the Himalayas and reached the Arabian Sea.Saraswati is among the most discussed rivers in the context of Indian history, the waters of which once flowed from the Himalayas to the Arabian Sea, separate from the other historically famous Indus river. Besides the river being mentioned repeatedly in the Vedas, Puranas, and the epics, in the first half of the 19th Century James Tod, an officer with the British East India company while documenting his extensive travels and explorations of Rajasthan called it the "lost river of the desert", and detailing its route said the river originated somewhere in the Siwalik Himalayas, passed through Hansi, Hisar, Hanumangarh, Rangmahal, Anupgarh, and Phulra, moving towards Derawar and Uch, where it was part of the dry bed of the 'Khaggar' between Jaisalmer and Rohri, and later "united with the branch from Dara... enlarging the eastern branch of the Delta of the Indus."



PURNIA IS SET TO BECOME BOOK LOVERS' PARADISE WITH LIBRARIES IN 190 PANCHAYATS

In preparation for competitive and other examinations, youth and students from Purina's remote regions have been coming to libraries to study books and browse journals.



Bihar's Purnia district has taken the initiative to be the first district to build libraries in every panchayat. The initiative aims to instill the love of reading in students and stop students from migrating from rural to urban regions. Purnia, a central district in Bihar's Seemanchal region, seems to have a low literacy rate of 52.09 % and yet has evolved into a book paradise, with 237 rural panchayat libraries and 230 rural panchayat libraries, as well as seven city Nagar Parishad libraries In January, a district-wide scheme named "Kitab Daan" was initiated to build libraries in each of Purnia's panchayats, the state's first of its kind. The efforts were led by District Magistrate Rahul Kumar, who worked with officials from the district department of education and villagers to build libraries in each panchayat.

ENERGY FOR A SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
